The Edson & District Leisure Centre was a busy place from March 18-20 as the 13th Annual Wilson's Hockey Tournament hosted 26 teams for a great weekend of hockey and giving back.

The first tournament was held in 2007 as a "fun year end tournament," said Colleen Wilson, who owns and operates Wilson Skate Sharpening alongside her husband.

The size of their tournament has grown significantly since that first year, which started with 4 teams, then grew to 16 teams for a few years, and now the tournament hosts four divisions that can accommodate up to 32 teams. Annual Tournament was another event that took a hit thanks to COVID, shutting them down for the past two years. Being able to come back made things all the more exciting this year.

The Wilsons had plans in place for this tournament since December, hoping that things would work out. "We were very grateful restrictions lifted," said Colleen.

One big aspect of the Tournament is that they raise money for the Run of Hope Cancer Support Group and the MS Society. The Cancer Support Group is a local organization and has been a recipient since the very beginning, whereas the MS Society was added a few years ago when Colleen was diagnosed with MS herself.

"Everyone knows someone with these diseases," Colleen said. With the help of raffle tables filled with great prizes, "We raised over \$10k," she said. "[It] will be like a 60/40

split."

A winning team is named among each of the four divisions, and the winner of each division gets a trophy. This year, the winning teams were as follows:

The Wilsons are already looking forward to next year, especially after hearing "nothing but positive reviews."

"Everyone was glad to be back, play hockey, see friends," said Colleen. "It's a lot of work, organizing teams, schedules, but we have awesome friends that volunteer their weekend with us. A lot of our success is made possible with the support of local businesses."

Liberals Voted Against Conservative Motion



OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform his constituents that although the Liberals acknowledged our natural gas is vital to our security and Europe's, they voted against our Conservative motion condemning Putin's illegal invasion of Ukraine and calling on the government to undertake measures to allow Canadian natural gas to be exported to Europe to displace Russian gas.

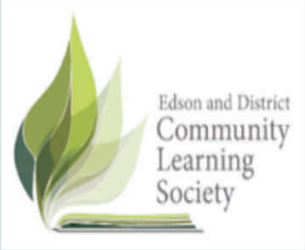

Flip-flops include AB gov't plan for traffic ticket 'adjudicator'

My column on January 31 titled "Traffic court option eliminated" talked about Phase 2 of the UCP government's Bill 21, taking away your right to a judicial trial if you disputed a traffic ticket.

cause of freeing up police officers and the court system. But this can not be achieved by imposing a greater injury of taking away the rights of citizens.

Well, with the all media attention and public backlash on the issue, the provincial government decided to scrap the plan. Bill 21 proposed to take away your right to your day in traffic court and replacing it with an online 'adjudicator' costing up to a non-refundable \$150.

Adding to Kenney's woes and missteps are new allegations coming to light that he knew more than he claimed regarding the plan for a kamikaze candidate in the UCP leadership race, according to witness statements discovered by CBC. The investigation is still ongoing and statements have yet to be tested in court.

The 'adjudicator', by the way, would have been appointed by and work for the very province that issued you the "notice of administrative penalty". Perception is important, and what's particularly shocking is how Kenney's government thought that seemed like a fair start to a hearing in the first place?

In another apparent flip-flop, the UCP board decided on March 22 to drastically change the rules of its upcoming leadership review. In-person voting in Red Deer has now been cancelled in favour of mail-in ballots by all members. Brian Jean commented that, "a rushed mail-in ballot is a formula for fraud and cheating. The UCP cannot survive another tainted vote."

Transport Minister Rajan Sawhney said on March 22 that part of the reasoning that the government decided to scrap the plan is because of public response to the changes. "We realized that there were elements of the program that were not as effective as we had hoped that they would be. And of course, we heard from Albertans..."

With an anticipated 20,000 people planning to attend the vote, not to mention Red Deer's economic boost, it seems everyone's plans will flip-flop at a board's whim.

The implementation of Phase 2 would have made Alberta the only province in Canada to eliminate the option of a court trial to dispute a traffic ticket.

Perception is important, so the question is, who is really benefiting from this radical last minute change after the cut-off to sign up new party members for the vote? Opponents say it's Kenney.

The fact is, this was a badly conceived plan directed at the worthy



Grade 4 students at Mary Bergeron Elementary in Edson learned about wheels and levers in science by examining and building devices with moving parts. Through the curriculum, students learn about the basic components of simple machines: how they are assembled, how they operate, how they are used. Students explored different techniques that can be used to transfer motion from one component to another, using simple connectors and various levers, gears, pulleys, and hand-driven systems. As they work with these components, they learn the functions that each can perform, including sample applications and ways that they can be used in a larger system.
