Grand opening of Pivotal Energy's processing facility

The Town of Edson officially welcomed Pivotal Energy to the community during the grand opening of their new

processing facility. Representatives from the town and council, along with Pivotal Energy executives and partners officially cut the ribbon at 11am on September 16.

The site, which has been under construction since spring of 2024, serves as a C3+ processing facility. C3+ is the natural liquid remnants of natural gas after the removal of

methane. It can be processed into three separate gas liquids products including propane, butane, and condensate. The site is set up for both truck and train hauling to and from the

Path will connect Vision Park and Weyerhaeuser to townsite

During the Edson Town Council meeting on September 17, council discussed the creation of a new connecting trail in Edson. The proposed trail extension along 6th Avenue would connect Vision Park and the Weyerhaeuser site to the rest of the town.

Weyerhaeuser presented as a delegation at the August 15, 2023, Regular Council meeting. They were awarded FRIAA grant funding and proposed a trail extension along 6th Avenue connecting Vision Park and the Weyerhaeuser Site to the rest of the Town of Edson (attachment #1). The proposed 6th Avenue Trail will be an approximately 650m of asphalt multiuse pathway connecting Vision Park to the Edson Health Care Center along the south side of the 6th Avenue road allowance.

Weyerhaeuser has also offered \$126,000 from their FRIAA grant funding to be allocated to the construction of the new trail. However, additional funds may be required depending on what the design estimate produces.

McElhanney was awarded the Storm Sewer Condition Assessment on November 23, 2023, with

a bid of \$88,534, which was well under the \$300,000 budget. Administration would like to use \$80,000 of the unused budget to fund the design of the 6th Avenue Trail to Vision Park. This design work was awarded to WSP for \$77,060.

The motion on the table was the allocation of funds from the Storm Sewer Condition Assessment to fund the creation of the 6th Avenue Multi-use Trail design. Administration already has a design firm in place, with WSP design selected through a tender process.

"The design will include, for the proposed road, concrete curb gutters, sidewalks and an asphalt multi-use trail. It will also include the future sanitary alignment and storm alignment. And any entrances and accesses required for the future roadway," said Ryan O'Sullivan, Transportation & Parks Manager. However, even though the tender design will include these items, the plan is to only proceed with the asphalt path for the 2025 construction season. "So we'll have the future design of the roadway so that we'll never have to come back and redesign and wipe out the asphalt path to build the road," added O'Sullivan.

Councillor Gean Chouinard asked, "It's \$80,000

to design something that is worth \$126,000 or am I missing something?" O'Sullivan explained, "The estimate came in high because we're designing the roadway that will fit on 6th Avenue from the Healthcare Centre all the way up to Gomuwka Drive. We're only constructing a multiuse pathway now. That's why the design came in a lot higher."

Mayor Kevin Zahara said, "I think it's very smart of us to ensure we have a full design for future growth. Having this plan in place and get the trail done paid for though the grant, I think is going to be fantastic." The motion was carried unanimously.

Edson Lions Club. Members of the Edson Lions Club presented a proposal to upgrade the Edson Lions Park Campground by adding full-service campsites, including water, power, and sewer hookups. The presentation included an ask for support from the Town to complete these upgrades.

location. Pivotal constantly sought and received input from the community and stakeholders over the course of the project. They hosted multiple open houses and forums to discuss the details with the community and affected parties.

Edson Mayor Kevin Zahara said, "It's been a long time coming, there's been a lot of hard work that made today happen, and we really want to thank Pivotal Energy Partners for choosing Edson as a place to do business."

Steven Duckett, President and CEO of Pivotal Energy, said, "This moment marks a significant milestone for our company and we're thrilled to be operational. Today is not just about cutting a ribbon it's about recognizing the hard

work, dedication, and support that's brought us to this point."

During the opening ceremonies, the official ribbon cutting took place. Pivotal then presented custom golden shovels to the Town of Edson and local partner Thermals Design, the lead engineering firm for the project.

Now that the plant is up and running, Pivotal and the Town of Edson are excited to see what will come from the partnership. "We have 15 full time jobs that have been created by this plant, and that's not the only benefit. It's supporting our local natural gas producers in the region which is critically important," said Mayor Zahara.

Duckett said, "As I stand here today, it's important to reflect on

what this facility brings to the area. With a capacity of 10,000 barrels per day, this facility not only represents a significant investment in the future growth of this area, but also positions Edson as a key link in other major markets.

"Moreover, our contribution to the local economy goes beyond job creation. Looking ahead we have plans for future expansion and development around this facility with millions of dollars earmarked for investment in Edson," Duckett added.

MLA Martin Long was also in attendance. "There are so many aspects of our economy that are up and down —this brings more stability to the region. It's a region that is very much a beneficiary of the

oil and gas sector and another company that supports the longevity of the oil and gas sector in this region will certainly benefit us for decades to come."

"In closing," Duckett said, "I want to thank all of you for your unwavering support here today. Today is a celebration of what we can achieve when we work together and we're excited about the future we will be able to build together."

ATCO proposes new natural gas pipeline from Peers to Edmonton

At their September 17 GPC Meeting, Yellowhead County Council heard from representatives of ATCO, who presented plans to construct a natural gas pipeline from Peers to the Industrial Heartland Area (IHA) east of Edmonton.

In attendance on behalf of ATCO were Brad Cann (Senior Manager, Project Execution), Zachary Giroux (EIT – Mainline west), and Greg Satre (Supervisor, Land).

Cann thanked Council and described the project as “up to 230 km of 36” steel high-pressure natural gas pipeline” with the purpose of “delivering new gas capacity primarily into the IHA near Edmonton.”

Cann said that a new delivery capacity of over 1 billion cubic feet per day is proposed “and the need for that additional capacity is for a number of customer projects... many of which are in the IHA but also throughout the province.”

Currently, a large portion of Alberta's gas production is to the northwest, and there are two main flow passes to get gas to the IHA, however the gas does not take a direct path. The Yellowhead Mainline Project will provide that central and direct flowline.

The additional flow path will “debottleneck the existing ones, which allows for new customers to get gas everywhere in the province, not just at the end of the pipeline,” explained Cann.

Cann presented a project overview map showing potential pipeline paths, stating those were the ones investigated so far. “The plans are

subject to change when we do our formal consultation with landowners and other stakeholders,” he said.

The pipeline will also feature an “approximately 17 MW compressor station installed near Peers to push the gas down the line and then we'll have a control station on either end, and throughout the route there will be block valve assemblies above ground at a certain frequency,” Cann said.

The project's next “major milestone” is the first of two major regulatory applications to the Alberta Utilities Commission. “The purpose of that application is really to approve the need of the project,” explained Cann. “The technical components, route selection, the environmental protection plans – that'll be evaluated in a subsequent application.”

Construction of the pipeline would aim to begin in Fall of 2026 with a target in-service date of Q4 in 2027.

Stakeholder engagement and communication is a large part of the process. “There are a high number of landowners, over 500 depending on the route, that we will be speaking with, as well as Indigenous communities, other communities, municipalities, and other stakeholder groups,” said Cann.

“We've already engaged over 90% of the landowners on the route and we're holding meetings... to let everybody know about the project and to collect feedback where we can to try and incorporate as much of that as possible into the project as early as we can,” said Cann. “Those remaining landowners and stakeholders we haven't met with yet, we're continuing to do that over

the next few months. When it comes to a sort of formal engagement, the actual land acquisition, and regulated consultation process, that's not going to start until probably Q1 next year.”

A cost estimate is still being finalized, but will be “in excess of \$2 billion,” said Cann. “Despite that cost we're expecting minimal impact to your typical residential bill [because] the project is underpinned by new customers to distribute the cost. So the costs go up but the number of customers paying for it also goes up, which nets us pretty close to neutral impact.”

Cann also shared with Council the expected economic benefits of the pipeline, noting that the project itself expects to create 2,000 jobs during construction and have a \$75M+ local community impact. In addition, the projects which will utilize the new pipeline have significant benefits.

The Dow Path2Zero project has a \$9 billion capital investment and expects to create 7,000 jobs during construction and 500 full-time jobs. Additional projects, combined, provide a potential \$9 to \$22 billion in capital investment, 12,000 jobs during construction, and 23,700 full-time jobs.

The Gross Value Added to the Alberta economy, annually, is expected to be \$1.6 billion during construction and \$3.9 billion once operational.

Councillor Anthony Giezen asked

if there was “any opportunity for using existing right-of-ways or are you thinking of all new separate right-of-ways on your development?”

“We do have one pipeline in the area but it's an older line with a smaller right-of-way and given that this is 36” we're not going to be able to fit that in the existing right-of-way. We're trying to follow existing infrastructure as much as possible but we'll need new right-of-way to do that,” Cann explained.

“Out here in Alberta we do realize that we still need our natural gas to heat our homes and things,” said Mayor Wade Williams, calling the project “exciting”. “These pipeline projects put a lot of money back into the economy and workforce. So, we are very happy to hear that there are still some projects going on.”



Notice of application to be filed for approval of the natural gas distribution franchise agreement between the Town of Edson and ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd.

Application summary

The Alberta Utilities Commission expects to receive an application from ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. to approve the existing current and valid natural gas distribution franchise agreement with the Town of Edson. This application for approval is required due to changes made by the *Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment Act, 2024*, to various statutes governing franchise agreements.

The current franchise agreement, which took effect in August of 2016, grants ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. the exclusive right to deliver natural gas to the residents of Town of Edson for approximately ten years.

No changes to the franchise agreement or to the franchise fee rate rider percentage are being made as part of this application. The franchise fee rate rider percentage will remain at its current rate, which is 22.54%. Including linear taxes, the resulting average monthly franchise fee for an average residential customer will remain the same at approximately \$13.81. The franchise fee is calculated based on distribution charges. An average residential customer uses about 105 gigajoules per year.

Last held in 2019, this year's event was equally well received. People enjoyed coming together to share a night of comedy, have some laughs, and join the community in supporting a worthy cause.

Marilyn Oishi, a director on the board for the Run of Hope foundation, said, "We have a sold-out venue of 320 people. It was such a great response from the community, we greatly appreciate all the support."

Oishi went on to introduce Run of Hope founder, Fern Foreman, who was in attendance that night, "My sister Vinia was diagnosed with breast cancer that had spread at time of diagnosis. As a family we supported her being at home and cared for in Edson during her final stages of cancer and life."

From this family's great loss, was born a passion to raise funds for breast cancer research. Foreman said, "We successfully started the Edson Run of Hope Foundation which initially started as a local support group for women

diagnosed with breast cancer. The fundraising for breast cancer research was a great success between the years 2001 to 2014 raising approximately \$350,000 with monies sent to the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation Prairies/NWT Chapter."

The Foundation's fundraising success was later expanded to include support to those living with other types of cancer, and needed financial support. "The Run of Hope established themselves as non-profit charitable foundation in 2015 to enable monies to stay within the Edson community," Foreman said.

Run of Hope has assisted over 200 individuals living with cancer. "Each one of you by being here becomes someone else's hero. There are no words, only tears of gratitude for the help. We would like to thank everyone for coming out tonight," said Oishi.

Honourable mentions went to the 874 Tiger Moth cadets and their leader Kelly Jensen who volunteered to help set up the hall.

While The Boob Tour Comedy night is one of their main fundraisers, their namesake fund raiser is still coming up on their 24 Annual Run of Hope for Cancer which takes place on Sunday October 6, at 1:00 p.m.

The production draws inspiration from the 1969-1997 tv show 'Hee Haw' which "represented an era of clean, family-friendly variety shows featuring tons of amazing talent within the country music genre, lots of corny humour, costumes, and pure entertainment," said Scott.

"She loves riding in the bus. Her favourite thing is to have one of the band throw her ball down the aisle of the bus while I drive," Scott said.

As for Scott, his favourite part "is meeting so many people," he said. "We can be 3-4,000 kms from home and yet we are treated like family. We really have an amazing life, travelling, seeing the beautiful geography of Canada firsthand, and meeting so many great people along way."

Suicide shouldn't be an uncomfortable topic

World Suicide Prevention Day is held annually in September. However, it's a topic that's far too important to simply encompass one day, or even one month.

It does, nevertheless, provide an opportunity to focus public attention on the issues and impacts of suicidal behaviours, as well as promote understanding about suicide, and suicide prevention.

Sadly, when suicide is discussed it is often only after a tragedy has occurred. Not so long ago it was even taboo to talk about it at all, often attaching it with a stigma of shame.

Today, suicide education is on the rise. Former misconceptions are being replaced with far more insightful and compassionate discussions on the causes of suicide and how to prevent it from happening.

Suicide can and does happen in all cultures, economic groups, genders, religions, and levels of education. Among those aged 15 to 34, suicide is typically the second leading cause of death, preceded only by accidents. Particular groups in Alberta, and across the country, are often disproportionately affected by suicide including people with mental illness or addictions, people who are socio-economically disadvantaged, Indigenous communities, men and boys, and members of the LGBTQ+ commu-

nity. However, no single determinant is enough on its own to cause suicide. Rather, suicide typically results from the interaction of many factors: relationship breakdowns, financial hardship, deteriorating physical health, a major loss, mental illness, or a lack of social support.

The Centre for Suicide Prevention describes a suicidal person as, "feeling so much pain that they can see no other option." In desperation they see death as a way to escape their overwhelming pain and anguish.

Suicide is preventable, and according to Alberta Health Services, talking or asking about suicide will not make someone suicidal. Talking about suicide is the first step to prevention.

Don't be afraid to ask someone directly if they are thinking about suicide. It can be a relief for them to be honest and feel understood. If you're worried about someone, one of the best things you can do is allow them to talk openly without judgment.

Attempting to get information about someone's state of mind is not intruding; it's the loving and appropriate thing to do.

There is still a lot of work to be done, but thankfully, we are becoming more enlightened and open to talk to others about this very important topic.
