# Q: How much do Approved Family Day Home Providers make each month?

A: Edson Family Day Home Providers set their own hours and rates. In the North Central Alberta area this is typically between \$550-\$900 per child per month depending on ages or a varying day rate.

Edson Family Day Home Providers also receive Gov't wage top-up funding depending on certification. This ranges between \$2.14-\$6.62/hour for every hour in child care a up to 181 hours per month.

For full time providers this is an additional \$260.64-\$1198.22 each month.

Edson Family Day Home Providers also receive \$150.00 Infant Incentive each month from the Government when they provide care for children under the age of 18 months.

#### Q: How do I become an Approved Family Day Home Provider?

- 1. Ask for an application form
- 2. Schedule a meeting with the Edson Family Day Home Coordinator
- Start screening for your family day home

#### Q: How much is the provider fee for Edson Family Day Home?

A: Edson Family Day Home Providers pay the Agency a fee of \$125.00 each month. Some of the services included in this fee are payments and billing, toys and materials, monitoring, coordination with families, provider meetings, assistance in planning activities, in-home assistance and more.

Edson Family Day Home Providers also pay \$45.00 each month for liability insurance.

# Q: What are the requirements to become an Approved Family Day Home Provider?

- Early Learning Certification or Equivalency
- Safe home that meets the Family Day Home Standards for Alberta.
- Clean Criminal Record Checks and Children Services Check on all individuals in the home over the age of 16 years.
- Current Level C First Aid.
- Passion for providing quality childcare.

# Suicide: an uncomfortable topic

topic that's far too important to simply encompass one day, or even

one month. It does, nevertheless, provide an opportunity to focus public attention on the issues and impacts of suicidal behaviours, as well as promote understanding about suicide, and suicide prevention.

Sadly, when suicide is discussed it is often only after a tragedy has occurred. Not so long ago it was even taboo to talk about it at all, often attaching it with a stigma of shame.

Today, suicide education is on the rise. Former misconceptions are being replaced with far more insightful and compassionate discussions on the causes of suicide and how to prevent it from happening. One of these misconceptions is that suicides increase during the holiday season, when in fact the rate is fairly constant throughout the year.

Suicide can and does happen in all cultures, economic groups, genders, religions, and levels of education. Among those aged 15 to 34, suicide is typically the second leading cause of death, preceded only by accidents. Particular groups in Alberta, and across the country, are often disproportionately affected by suicide including people with mental illness or addictions, people who are socio-economically disadvantaged, Indigenous communities, men and boys, and members of the LGBTQ+ community.

However, no single determinant, including mental illness, is enough

on its own to cause suicide. Rather, suicide typically results from the interaction of

many factors. For example: relationship breakdowns, financial hardship, deteriorating physical health, a major loss, mental illness, or a lack of social support.

The Centre for Suicide Prevention describes a suicidal person as, "feeling so much pain that they can see no other option. They feel that they are a burden to others, and in desperation see death as a way to escape their overwhelming pain and anguish. The suicidal state of mind has been described as constricted, filled with a sense of self-hatred, rejection, and hopelessness."


Suicide is preventable, and according to Alberta Heath, talking or asking about suicide will not make someone suicidal. Talking about suicide is the first step to prevention. Warning signs of suicide could include giving away possessions, saying goodbye, researching suicide methods, or talking about being a burden to others.

Don't be afraid to ask someone directly if they are thinking about suicide. It can be a relief for them to be honest and feel understood. If you're worried about someone, one of the best things you can do is allow them to talk openly without judgment.

Attempting to get information about someone's state of mind is not intruding; it's the loving and appropriate thing to do.

There is still a lot of work to be done, but thankfully, we are becoming more enlightened and open to talk to others about this very important topic.

# **Venture capital statement: Martin Long**



Parliamentary secretary for small business and tourism Martin Long issued the following statement in response to the Canadian Venture Capital and Private Equity Association's second-quarter report:

"Thanks to the Alberta government's determination to diversify the provincial economy, attract investment, and create jobs, Alberta's venture capital investment has continued its sustained, exponential

growth.

'Alberta's second quarter of 2022 saw 33 venture capital deals worth \$70 million, building on our robust first quarter, which saw \$411 million in investment. With 56 deals worth \$481 million in venture capital investment in the first six months, we are on pace to shatter last year's record of \$561 million. "Alberta's 56 venture capital deals closed in the first half of the year puts us narrowly behind British Columbia's 58 and gaining fast, with a the number of deals closed quarter after quarter. This strong increase in early-stage deals sets the stage for Alberta-based start-ups to mature and attract greater investment.

"Both Edmonton and Calgary's tech sectors are seeing significant growth. Calgary ranked as the fourth-highest city in the country for venture capital investment at 42 deals, only two behind Vancouver and five behind Montreal. Edmonton was fifth in the nation.

"Our continued increases in the amount of venture capital deals and investment send a strong signal to the rest of the country and the world that we are developing a robust innovation ecosystem. Alberta's government has supported our emerging tech and innovation sector by increasing the number of incubators, accelerators, and organizations that support entrepreneurs to start, grow, and remain in Alberta.


